SWIMMING HOLE



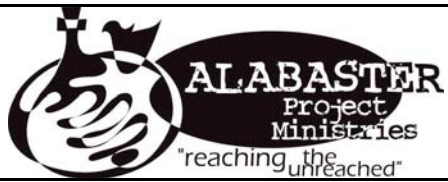
