Recently, we visited Kumasi, a large metropolitan city in the southern part of Ghana. A picture is shown of the **Kayayos** (translated meaning: **load carrying women**) who for various reasons leave their villages and run away to the inner cities to live in the streets and do all kinds of work to earn money. After talking with the young girls, they told us that their hope is to earn enough money to buy sewing machines and become seamstresses or learn some other skill to support themselves. Some of the women have babies that they also have to take care of while on the streets.
