JSS STUDENTS



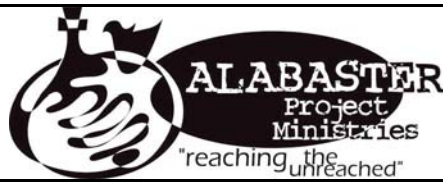
