DENTAL RESEARCH TEAM

The dental research team comprising of Dr. Charlie Vittitow, his wife Sherry and their son, Chaz, Dr. Denny Scharine, Dr. Robert Kovarik and his wife Kim, Judy Skelton and her son David came to conduct a scientific research of the effectiveness of the lay dentistry program as compared to the traditional dental program. This was an intense program. We treated over 400 patients in 4 days and we did over 300 tooth extractions.

The team from the University of Kentucky, Lexington was led by Jeremy Buchanan and his wife, Jenna. Jeremy's parents were missionaries to Ghana for several years. This is the third time that he has led teams to Alabaster Project in Tamale. They concentrated their efforts on our farming project, plowing, harrowing and sowing corn on our 13 acre farm.
