A Jeep was also donated, which has been put to work right away. The Jeep was a big hit in Blisinga, everybody loves it.

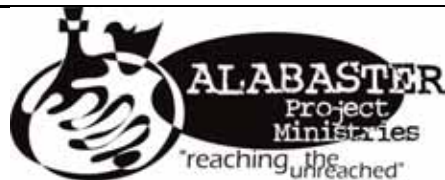
