EVENING CLASSES AT SANGA VILLAGE



We have started a night school for the men in Sanga Village. The majority of the men is illiterate and is very desirous of learning to read so that they can improve themselves. There 36 men from 5 different villages all come together at Sanga Village at night from 8:30 to 10:30 Monday thru Friday. Even though there is no electricity these men are pushing themselves to study by using lanterns. These men include both Muslims, Christian, pagans both old and young.

COMMUNITY BUILDING

Our hope is that bring fish farming here will help to reduce malnutrition and sicknesses as well as provide a means of income for the villagers.
