

## **MIDWIVES**





When cutting the umbilical cord they unknowingly used a wrong measurement. They were very excited to learn the proper procedure and the correct length when cutting the umbilical cord. The picture of the young boy bares witness to the magnitude of the problem with untrained village midwives.
