In 2012 the Lord made it clear to us that we need to open mission bases in north Africa. Subsequently, we established our Mali mission base 12 years ago. Seven years ago the Lord led us to another country in north Africa and for the past 7 years we have been going there

to do short term mission while looking for our own facility. Last month the Lord supplied the resources needed and we have acquired a property of land with some buildings on it, we are actively engaged in establishing our dental and eyecare facilities on that property. We have a sister ministry from Brazil that is sending us two agricultural specialist to live with the people, training the indigenous how to farm in a



desert environment. The Lord has opened a great door of ministry.



EYE CLINIC

This young wife and mother of two small children has lost complete vision in her right eye and has about 20% vision in her left eye. Without surgery she may go completely blind in both eyes. In the area where she lives that means a condemnation to losing her family and becoming a beggar. We are hoping to bring ophthalmol-



ogists to Bethany Village in April who may be able to save at least one of her eyes so that she may be able to maintain her marriage and quality of life. *Please pray that she does not have glaucoma so that we can help her through surgery.*

NEW LAY DENTIST

Rarely, does one see a young man diligent in his service to God. Peter an orphan, is one of such, who has faithfully served in the ministry of Alabaster Project. He has been trained to be a dental assistant. Over the past several weeks Peter is now in training to become a lay dentist. He is one of



the few Dagombas reaching out to his unreached tribe with the gospel of Jesus Christ.

The widows in the villages of Gawagu and Cheshegu were very grateful to receive the produce from our farms. They praised God with a thankful heart for His
