DENTAL AND EYE CLINIC

The Lord has been truly faithful in helping us to reopen our eye clinic. We were able to develop a safe protocol to help us to continue seeing



patients despite the pandemic. We have instituted the following safety requirement:

- With no exception, *mandatory wearing of face masks at all time* on our compound, Bethany Village during clinic.

- *Everyone must sanitize their hands* before entering the clinic.
- *Social distancing* must be adhered to and the presentation of the gospel is still our top priority.



It was difficult for us to establish an acceptable protocol for the dental clinic; yet because of the many petitions and requests for service we persevered to reopen the dental clinic. Many patients with distressing conditions had no other place to go for help. These acted as catalyst to push us to develop a protocol. In January we were able to put together an acceptable protocol that meets WHO, CDC and the government of Ghana's recommendation.

So presently both the eye clinic and the dental clinic are open, and God continues to use these clinics to propagate the gospel of Jesus Christ and to help those who are suffering with various ailments.

CHRISTMAS 2020

Christmas is truly our favorite time of the year. It affords us the opportunity to show the love of Christ by inviting both believers and unbelievers to join in the celebration of the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. During this time even some of the most stanch unbelievers do allow their families to participate in the celebration. Food is prepared for 200-300 people. We accumulate presents



all through the year in anticipation of this wonderful Christmas celebration. The two highlights of this celebration are the singing of Christian songs with dancing and the Bible Trivial segment. We ask bible questions and those who answer correctly receive presents. This encourages even unbelievers to study the scriptures so that they can answer the questions correctly and receive presents. It is truly a time of love, friendship, and celebrations for all of us, both believers and unbelievers. Of course, not to mention feasting on the traditional rice and beans.



MINISTRY BUILDING

The largest structure on our ministry base in Ghana is the ministry building. It is a two story multi-functional ministry building. The first floor has been completed for some years now. We have been holding conferences and medical training and afterschool



program in this facility. We are presently working to complete the second floor which will double the capacity of building and afford us opportunity to do more things at Bethany Village. It is quite an undertaking because there are three large auditori-

ums on

each floor with office space and bathrooms on each end of the building. A team of seasoned construction workers have come from Accra and are staying here until the building is completed. We are thankful to the Lord for allowing us to accomplish this for we have been praying about it for years and now is the time the Lord would have us to complete it.
