

### WALLS

We had several days of reflections as we repaired the walls around our base in North Africa. Reinforcing the wall around the property is prudent, as we are expecting a container load of medical equipment and other necessary items needed to run an efficient mission base, and medical clinics. Walls represent security



in most cases. When we think of the wall around our base, it reminds us of the wall mentioned in the book of Revelation, the New Jerusalem having a great and high wall. (Rev. 21: 10-21) This wall has a foundation of precious stones. God is very extravagant and he gives all things liberally. When God spoke to us to go into all the world and preach the gospel of the Kingdom of God, He asked us to give of ourselves liberally for Him. In the book of (Matthew, 26:6-8), this liberal giving was seen by the disciples as a waste. In other words, only the best for Him, knowing that He has given His very best to us.

#### MAKING DISCIPLES

We have been hosting discipleship meetings in the village of Limo for several years. Pastor Silas and his wife, Memunatu, both have a heart to reach their community with the gospel of Jesus Christ. Limo is an unreached village located southwest of Tamale. This Assemblies of God church caters to four villages.



Each Saturday we meet to study scriptures, ask questions, encourage the believers, and discuss various community issues that affect their lives, taking every opportunity to share the love of Christ. The questions always center around how we can apply the word of God to our daily walk with Him. Each Sunday Pastor Silas or his wife can be heard sharing with their congregation the scriptures that were expounded on during the discipleship gathering the Saturday before. Believers walk 20 to 50 kilometers to worship with other believers. As a result, not one village but five villages are being discipled from one meeting with our disciples.
